


# The gospel of John

*Some considerations on reading, studying and presenting the gospel of John to your family or a small group.*

*Session 18 – John 6:1-15*

In John 6, we have 2 narratives (just like chapter 5) followed by 2 conversations. Today we want to examine the first of the narratives.



Which verses cover the background?

In what verse(s) does the tension appear?

In what verse does the culmination take place?

What verses develop the tension?

What verses describe the resolution and new situation?

Notice an important thread that has developed:

*John 1:29 – Here is the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!*

*John 2:13 – The Jewish Passover was near, so Jesus went up to Jerusalem...*

*John 2:23 – While He was in Jerusalem at the Passover Festival...*

*John 5:45-47 – Moses...*

*John 6:4 – Now the Passover, a Jewish festival, was near.*

Old Testament connections:

*Jeremiah 31:14 – My people will be \_\_\_\_\_ with My goodness.*

*2 Kings 4:42-44 – A man from Baal-shalishah came to the man of God with his sack full of 20 loaves of \_\_\_\_\_ bread from the first bread of the harvest. Elisha said, “Give it to the people to eat.” But Elisha’s attendant asked, “What? Am I to set 20 loaves before 100 men?” “Give it to the people to eat,” Elisha said, “for this is what the LORD says: ‘They will eat, and they will have some left over.’” So he gave it to them, and as the LORD had promised, they ate and had some left over.*

*Deuteronomy 18:15, 18-19 – The LORD your God will raise up for you a \_\_\_\_\_ like me from among your own brothers. You must listen to him... I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among their brothers. I will put My words in his mouth, and he will tell them everything I command him. I will hold accountable whoever does not listen to My words that he speaks in My name.*
